## About the role

As a Residential Care Worker, you will assist people through their recovery journey in a mutually supportive environment. Your primary role is to oversee the welfare and safety of residents during the night shift periods and the weekends. These shifts may include escorting the community members on social outings in our 11seater buses safely, so driving competence is essential. Your experience with AOD means you can provide direct empathy for our participants along with an inherent understanding of the recovery journey.

**Hours and location:** You have flexible availability to work sleepover shifts, weekends, and public holidays. Sleepover shifts are from 5.00 pm - 11.00 pm. After sleeping onsite, you will work from 6.00 am to 8.45 am. Day shifts on weekends are 8.00 am to 5.15 pm. It is anticipated that we may have 1-3 shifts available per week. Our site is located at Binna Burra, near Bangalow.

The role is funded until 30th June 2026.
